The operators conveniently ignored the discouraging advices from upcountry exchanges. Thanks to the large scale support by the institutional support. The unnerving bear hammering and unabated long liquidation, which had gripped the market during the few days, seemed to have been effectively arrested.

The Steel recovered from 190.75 to 199.50 on heavy institutional support before finishing at ₹ 193.75 gaining four points. TELCO also moved up to ₹ 421.5 on speculative support, reacting thereafter on profit taking to close at ₹ 419 with small gain of one point. Century from ₹ 6105 rose sharply to ₹ 6,125 on fresh support before setting at ₹ 6,118. In kerb deal, trading activity was negligible and remained restricted to some deals in TISCO. The cash section too displayed a positive outlook.
