Early afternoon, Clarke won the toss and put his men in to bat first, getting huge edge over Dhoni. Chasing a massive target under lights at the SCG is not easy and some of India's leading batsmen eventually made a mess of it with undesirable strokeplay. But before it came to the chase, it was the bowling attack that wilted under pressure against the imposing hosts. The dangerous David Warner departed early after top-edging a catch off Umesh Yadav but Australia's No. 3, Steven Smith, played the innings of the match-105 off 93 balls-that set the tone for the game.

The young man kept rotating the strike, allowing the struggling Aaron Finch to take his time. The two batsmen went on to add 183 runs for the second wicket, a partnership that first threatened to take Australia's total past the 350-mark.

R. Ashwin ended up being India's most economical bowler at 4.20 per over but it was Shami, with 17 wickets in the tournament, who showed some purpose once again. Shami maintained a discipline line that his fellow-pacers failed to take a cue from. Umesh ended up picking a four-wicket haul that came at cost of 72 runs while Mohit Sharma strayed throughout his spells. The prospect of a successful chase looked bleak for India after Aussies were done with Maxwell, Watson and Faulkner contributing to the total. However, it was an exceptional start provided by Rohit and Dhavan that enlivened the proceedings.
