Those who survived have not been able to recover completely. In yet another incident in Delhi, at least four children died in a bizarre incident. Meanwhile, in the Rohtak tragedy, those who were killed were, in fact, bonded labourers. They used to be locked inside the factory gates and were forced to work for little or no wages. However, the owner of the factory who has perpetrated these inhuman atrocities was charged with a minor bailable offence-causing death due to negligence.
