DEGREE OF THE MASTER OF SURGERY

M.S. Examinations

O. M.S.-1 :

(a) The Degree of Master of Surgery (M.S.) shall be conferred by examination with dissertation in the following branches :

- (i) General Surgery
- (ii) Oto-rhino-laryngology
- (iii) Orthopaedics
- (iv) Ophthalmology
- (v) Anatomy.

(b) The Degree of Master of Chirurgie (M.Ch.) shall be conferred by Examination with dissertation in the following Branches of speciality :

- (i) Neurosurgery
- (ii) Cardiothoracic Surgery
- (iii) Genito Urinary Surgery
- (iv) Plastic Surgery
- (v) Gastroenterology Surgery
- (vi) Oncology Surgery
- (vii) Paediatrics Surgery.

O. M.S.-2 :

(a) Every candidate for the Degree of Master of Surgery in the branches referred to in Clause (a) of Ordinance M.S.-1 must have taken the Degree of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of this University or any University recognised by this University

(reciprocity essential). Such a candidate can appear thereat four academic years or eight academic terms after passing the M.B., B.S. Examination including compulsory rotating Internship period of one year.

A post-graduate medical student shall get himself registered within three months of the commencement of his post-graduate course and specify the branch of study for which he wants registration. However, he will be allowed to change the Branch during first two months (Subject to O. M.S. 14).

- (b) Every candidate for the degree of Master of Chirurgie (M.Ch.) in the branches referred to in clause (b) of O.M.S.-1 must have taken the degree of Master of Surgery (M.S.) as per column-I below of this University or any University recognised by this University (Reciprocity essential) for registering the degree as per column-II.

Column-I

1. M.S. Br. I (General Surgery) OR M.S. Br. IV (Orthopedics)
2. M.S. Br. I (Gen. Surgery)

Column-II

1. M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) OR M.Ch. (Plastic Surgery)
2. M.Ch.-any branch.

A post-graduate medical student shall get himself registered within three months of the commencement of his post-graduate course and specify the branch of study for which he wants registration.

Dissertation

O. M.S.-3 :

Every candidate presenting himself for the Examination for the first time, shall submit with his application for admission to the examination, six typewritten copies of the a dissertation prepared under the direction and guidance and to the satisfaction of his University teacher. The dissertation and application for admission to the examination must be submitted* **six months** before the examination. The dissertation may relate to a piece of work which the student has carried out under a supervisor. It should relate to a series of clinical cases, seen by

him, or autopsy records or to discussion of a topical (modern or historical) or a review of the work on specific theme. The Dissertation shall be referred to the Examiners for the particular Branch, and acceptance of it by the Examiners shall be a pre-condition for appearing at the rest of the examination. It may form the basis of the viva-voce examination and due credit may be given to the same.

When the dissertation is rejected, the examiners shall clearly specify the reasons for the same for the guidance of the candidate. He shall not be eligible to resubmit the dissertation within six months of receiving the letter of rejection.*

C. M.S.-4 :

A candidate who has submitted his dissertation once, will not be required to submit a fresh dissertation if he reappears for the examination in the same Branch on a subsequent occasion provided that the dissertation has been accepted by the Examiners for which a report is obtained. He shall, however, be required to submit a fresh dissertation if he seeks admission to the examination in another Branch.

Submission of a Thesis

C.M.S. 5 :

A thesis will be an original expetiation on a subject, which is original in itself or original in its interpretation, based on the work of the candidate.

A candidate who wishes to appear by thesis for the M.S. Examination, will inform the University of the subject of his thesis at least one year prior to the examination. He will submit his thesis prepared under the directions and guidance and to the satisfaction of his teachers or guide at least six months before the commencement of the examination. The thesis will be referred to a referee and the candidate will be informed about the amount of this exemptions, if any, as regard the papers at least three months before the commencement of the examination. The candidate will have to appear in the papers in which Referee has not exempted him. He will have to appear in any case for the clinical, practical and viva-voce examinations. (In case, the candidate fails to pass

the examination he will have to appear in the same papers only and clinical, practical and viva-voce examinations).

O. M.S.—6 :

The clinical courses be completed by residency or higher full-time appointment (Tutor, Asst. Professor etc), or Post-graduate studentship of three years duration under recognised post-graduate teacher in the subject (speciality) concerned. Out of these three years maximum of one year (Two terms) may be by rotation under recognised post-graduate teacher or teachers of allied branches as per Regulation R. M.S.—3.

O. M.S.—13 :

A candidate after having passed post-graduate Diploma in a subject if he gets registration for a Post-graduate Degree in the same subject will be required to put in at least two academic years or four academic terms regular training in the department concerned prior to appearing at M.S. Degree Examination.
