INTRODUCTION

The Profession of Nursing aspires towards optimum health of every individual and community. The growing complexity of Scientific and technological development has changed the trends of health concepts and illness patterns. In the light of these changes, it is imperative that nurses accept the challenge to stride forward to meet individual and community needs. Nursing science has to keep pace with the development in other health professions for optimum co-ordination & integration of health sciences.

Nursing is a positive health science which necessitates prompt updating and furthering of knowledge and skills in specialized clinical areas. It is felt among nurses in India that higher education in Nursing Science would contribute to improved nursing care and maintain effective collaboration with other health professionals.

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M.Sc. NURSING SYLLABUS

M.sc. Nursing examination rules:-

- 1) Minimum Pass Mark Shall be 50% in each Nursing Subject. Theory and practical separately.
- 2) For non Nursing Subjects Psychological Foundation, Human Relations Minimum pass marks shall be 40%.
- 3) A Candidate Must have Minimum of 80% Attendance.
(irrespective of the kind of absence in theory and Practical in each subject for appearing for examination.)
- 4) A candidate has to pass in theory and Practical exam separately in each of the paper.
- 5) Maximum number of attempts permitted for each paper is 3 (three) paper including first attempt.
- 6) Candidate is permitted four attempts. After that also if candidate fails, he/she has to attend one year study course for 1st year or 2nd year M.Sc. Nursing and then he/she will be allowed two attempts either M.Sc. 1st year/2nd year.
- 7) A candidate is to be permitted to continue second year terms irrespective of her/his failure in number of paper/s of first year examination.
But candidate must pass all the subjects of first year before appearing the examination of second year subject.
- 8) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4(four) years.
- 9) Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 10 per day.
- 10) All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
- 11) One Internal and one External Examiners should jointly conduct Practical examination for each student.
- 12) An examiner should be a Lecturer or above in a College of Nursing with M.Sc. Nursing in concerned subject and is recognized as P.G. Teacher under University Rules.
