(a) Moot-Court:

Each student will conduct atleast three Moot courts in a semester with 10 marks for Each. The moot court work will be assigned Problems and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for Oral advocacy. The written submission Shall be recorded in the prescribed diary.

The panel to evaluate moot court performance of each student shall consist of the Principal or his/her nominee and the concerned teacher assigned with the subject.

(b) Observance of trial in two cases one Civil and one Criminal.

Civil case	15 marks
Criminal Case	15 marks

Students will attend two trials in the course of the last 2 years of I.L.B. Studies or in IIIrd LL.B. They will maintain a record and enter various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment (diary). Attendance and performance to be certified by Advocates, enrolled and recognized by the Bar Council.
