ENGLISH

Compulsory English Course for F.V.B.A. Examinations of March/April, 2002 onwards Bridge Course for 'B' Stream of F.Y.B.A., F.Y.B.Com, and F.Y. Dyama

Bridge course is to be given at the outset to the students enrolling in 'B' stream. They have different to tell of proficiency in finglish and so need to be brought on par. It is suggested to have 21 lectures, each 6, 45 minutes before the beginning of the teaching of regular syllabus. The said course should have a etest to judge the standard of the entrants. It should also have a post-test to judge the student's progress.

The following components and an approximate number of 21 lectures (of 45 minutes each) assuggested. However, the teacher would be well advised to lay stress on those items in which a particular group (as would be evident from the pre-test) is week.
